The show will be followed by a short presentation with Jay's vegetable oil powered van. Library Looks at Sites for New Building

The Library Design Study Committee (LDSC) has selected four sites to study as possible locations for a new library: the current library site on Bardwell Street, the current SHELD site on Main Street, the former Sheridan & Sheridan property on Newton Street, and the Northeast Utilities property at the corner of Main & Canal Streets. Architects have reviewed the four sites and determined that each would be able to accommodate a new 22,000 square foot building—with the geography and zoning regulations at each site determining what type of building might go there. 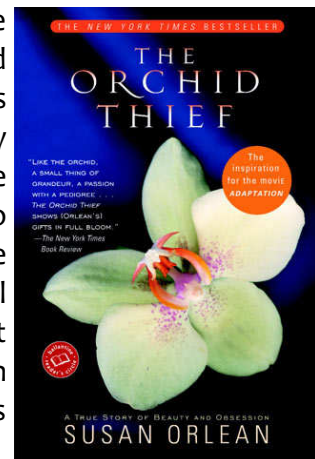

The Orchid Thief—Book Discussion Wednesday June 23 @7:00

The Orchid Thief is Susan Orlean's true story of beauty and obsession. In 1994, a renegade plant dealer and three Seminole Indians were arrested with rare orchids they had stolen from a wild swamp in south Florida that is filled with some of the world's most extraordinary plants and trees. The thief had planned to clone the orchids and then sell them for a small fortune to impassioned collectors. After he was caught in the act, Laroche set off one of the oddest legal controversies in recent memory, which brought together environmentalists, Native American activists, and devoted orchid collectors. The result is a true tale that is strange, compelling, and hilarious.

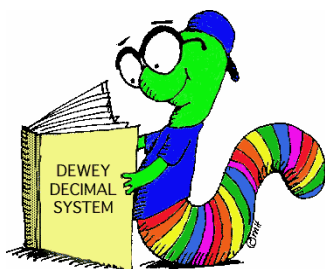
